**ARTICLE 1.**

**Preamble**

The State of Connecticut, acting by and through the Chief Court Administrator of the Connecticut Judicial Branch, hereinafter called "the Judicial Branch" or "the Employer," and the State of Connecticut Judicial Employees, Local 749, Council 4, American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, hereinafter called "the Union" or "AFSCME."

Witnesseth:

Whereas the parties to this Agreement desire to establish a state of amicable understanding, cooperation and harmony; and

Whereas the parties to this Agreement consider themselves mutually responsible to improve the public service through increased morale, efficiency and productivity: Now, therefore, the parties mutually agree as follows:

**ARTICLE 2.**

**Recognition**

**Section 1.** The Judicial Branch of the State of Connecticut herein recognizes the State of Connecticut Judicial Employees Local 749, Council 4, AFSCME, AFL-CIO as the exclusive representative of the employees in permanent positions regularly working 20 or more hours per week whose job titles were placed within this bargaining unit of judicial employees by the Connecticut State Board of Labor Relations in Cases No. SE-5973, SE-5981 and SE-9263 with the exception of employees whose titles have been removed either in Cases No. SEE-9659 and SEE-9660 or by mutual agreement of the parties.

Accordingly, this Agreement shall pertain only to those employees whose job titles fall within the certifications above cited and shall not apply to employees who are paid on the temporary payroll. Persons otherwise eligible serving a working test period are included.

**Section 2.** Coverage of newly created or acquired job classifications by the Agreement (so-called "accretions") shall be determined as follows:

(a) The Employer shall notify AFSCME in writing of the new classification, the contemplated pay group (if any) and the Employer's position concerning inclusion or exclusion. The Employer shall continue its prac-

CERTIFICATION OF REPRESENTATIVE

Pursuant to the Agreement for Consent Elections, dated September 17, 1979, elections by secret ballot were conducted on October 22, 23, 24, 1980, under the supervision of the Connecticut State Board of Labor Relations, among the non-professional employees of the State of Connecticut, Judicial Department. Copies of Report Upon Secret Ballot were duly served on all of the parties. No exceptions to thereport have been filed with the Board.

Inasmuch as the void and challenged ballots do not affect the majority designation of AFSOME - American Federation of State, County & Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, no determination will be made with regard to them.

Since the parties have agreed that the unit is appropriate, the Board's approval of the action herein is not to be taken as a precedent as to what unit it would find appropriate in the absence of such an agreement.

**CERTIFICATION OF REPRESENTATIVE**

By virtue of and pursuant to the power vested in the Connecticut State Board of Labor Relations by An Act Concerning Collective Bargaining for State Employees, it is hereby

**CERTIFIED**, that AFSOME - American Federation of State, County & Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, has been designated as the representative for the purposes of collective bargaining by a majority of non-professional employees of the State of Connecticut, Judicial Department in the classifications described on the attached list, and that said AFSOME is the exclusive representative of all said employees for the purpose of collective bargaining with respect to wages, hours and other conditions of employment. This designation is to take effect as follows: (1) forthwith, for the purpose of negotiating a successor to the existing contract covering said employees; (2) from and after July 1, 1981, for all other purposes including the collection of union dues.

CERTIFIED, that the existing unit of State of Connecticut, Judicial Department employees, represented by Local 749 of Council No. 4, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, is expanded to include all Blue Collar employees, and that said Local 749 of Council No. 4, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, is the exclusive representative of all said employees for the purposes of collective bargaining in respect to wages, hours and other conditions of employment.
